Our goal as an organisation is to support community activities to the performing arts. More specifically, the running of a monthly poetry and music open mic. We feel that it is of utmost importance to provide a free and accessible route into the arts, especially for the current demographic.

Naturally, we've sought to capture the magic that happens at Poetical Word. This has lead us to set up a Multimedia Production studio. We have an eye for creating positive and uplifting videos, so we've incorporated it into our organisation.

Throughout the year, we've subsequently built relationships with organisations like Autism Hounslow, We Are One, Care UK, Hounslow Holy Trinity Church, Gunnersbury Park Museum, Grenfell Tower Relief Project, S.W.A.T (the Sikh Welfare and Awareness Team), Hounslow Arts Centre and Hounslow Youth Centre as well as individuals from the local council including Mayor of Hounslow Cllr Sue Sampson, Deputy Mayor of Hounslow Cllr Mukesh Malhotra.

Over the last three years we've worked towards our annual Christmas endeavour-Xmas Gifts 4 All; which proved to have such a defining impact, it spurred us to launch Hounslow Soup Kitchen- which supports the homeless back into society. This was a massive milestone for us.





On the 3rd of August, we launched the Neurodiversity Shindig in partnership with Autism Hounslow to promote acceptance, awareness and inclusion through a series of




performances and talks. The event launch was hosted at the Watermans Arts Centre, Brentford, where the group meet once a month for an evening drop in session.

Her work has appeared in anthologies and publications worldwide. She regularly performs with Poetry Brothel London in the









On the 30th October, Poetical Word hosted a halloween themed open mic down at the Youth Centre.


To promote this event, and our headliner, we used our social media platforms to post halloween prompts in which our viewers would be given a halloween themed word to seek creative inspiration from.











































Headlining the night, we were delighted with yet another memorable performance by the amazingly talented Abe Gibson. Cake and refreshments were also heartily enjoyed.

"Objects and Collections"



Gunnersbury Park collections are rich and diverse and provide a fascinating insight into the history of Ealing, Hounslow and the surrounding areas.


From the famous Lucozade sign, formerly visible to motorists driving along the M4, to beautiful collages by textile designer Joyce Clissold, many of the items in Gunnersbury Park collections tell local stories. Poetical Word visited some of these collections to create a real connection with the lives of local people in the past.
















The collections included materials that trace the history and development of the

Gunnersbury estate, its landscape, and the people who lived and worked there. From paintings to maps, plans and inventories to architectural items and the stunning collection of carriages owned by the Rothschild family, the collections we saw provided a fascinating glimpse into Gunnersbury across the ages.

We were able to see some of the archaeology collections, including Palaeolithic flint tools, Bronze Age swords and Iron Age spearheads. We also saw local entertainment collections,




including many items relating to the golden age of Ealing Studios, local industry collections that trace the growth of manufacturing in the area and personal collections of local people.

The aim for this immersion was to create a spoken word piece which was to be presented to the public at a poetry event in December.

This was an great opportunity for Poetical Word to network with wider communities outside of Hounslow and extend our reach to Ealing.





Following this magical event, through networking and reaching out to the audience, we've had regular attendance by individuals who attend events we've held since.

Working with Gunnersbury Park, namely, Sharon Walters, has been extremely easy and very well planned. We are eagerly looking forward to more collaborative events and creative projects in the future.

Xmas Gifts 4 All 2017

Annual Charity Endeavour

Our annual charity endeavour was in its third and final year in 2017. This year marked the culmination of three years of service and community spirit and this is how we done it.



During the 2015 Christmas period, Poetical Word delivered £700 worth of gifts to children in West Middlesex Hospital with aims to serve the community and those who would be spending Christmas away from home. The following year, we were able to do the same in addition to visiting an older people's care home and putting on a poetry show.

In 2017, through some effective marketing campaigns, and the help of local community groups, we were able to raise £1300. In addition to the above, we were able to deliver 110 essential packs to the homeless in central London.











These essential packs has items in them which we felt a homeless person cannot do without. As our founder has experienced homelessness himself, he has first hand knowledge of the project needs. As such, we had items like toothpaste, toothbrushes, female sanitary pads, socks, gloves, a woolly hat, a brand new woolly zipped hoodie, a reusable bottle of water, hand wipes, toilet accessories, deodorant, razor blades and some dried fruit or granola bars.



We worked with a host of organisations including, Humanity First, Grenfell Tower Relief Project, Autism Hounslow, SWAT (the Sikh Welfare and Awareness Team), Hounslow Holy Trinity Church and many other individuals across West London to raise money and prepare for the project. One of the ways in which we raised money

was through mentioning it at our events, collaborations and also holding a movie night. Without the support of the local community, this project could never have gone ahead.



In total, we handed out 110 homeless essential packs as well as an additional 132 throughout the festive period.




One of the other objectives of the XG4All project was to spread cheer to the children at the West Middlesex Hospital Paediatrics ward. We got together a small team that worked tirelessly to ensure everything was ready for Christmas Eve. The team was lead by Mindy Sidhu who was instrumental in bringing the project together. Our initiator, Dr. Randeep Karwal was also instrumental in providing guidance when needed.









Delivering this project allowed us to be there for those people who couldn't spend Christmas at home with their own family. Where many people spend this period in festives, there are also many people who feel extremely left out, lonely and isolated, so we decided to sacrifice our Christmas for the sake of theirs; and the effect it it continues to have is lasting.

We created a video which documented the project, which can be seen on our YouTube channel or our website.

One of the highlights of this project for us was helping Hounslow Youth Centre put on a dinner for those alone at Christmas. The event saw around 150 older people enjoy a hearty Christmas meal in the company of Hounslow Mayor Cllr Sue Sampson.










MERAKI





our feet or the sound of gravel inside of a glass jar or even the sound of a heavy stone being thrown in a well.








We used different techniques and objects to inspire us to come up with a creative manifestation of the energies of the day.



Project Launch- 18/2/18



This year was the year when we launched: The Brew Crew. A monthly break away from society and its troubles. The Brew Crew serves as a place of inspiration where writers can recluse to tap their creative juices. Currently based in Starbucks on the High Street in Hounslow, every month we gather to write, read and create through the poetic spirit.

We are working with an amazing poet who goes by the pen name, Lady Poe to bring you this creative space.
Participants can choose whether to be guided through a prepared class, or to sit aside and work on their own thing in the company of creatives.

With the rush of modern day scheduling, it seems as though we

need to find time to allow ourselves to feel; and to express that through the written word. We hope to channel the activities of the group towards producing an annual journal.

Hounslow Soup Kitchen

Supporting the homeless

The goal of Hounslow Soup Kitchen is to enable individuals to strengthen their individual capacities by being an active member of the society they live in. We plan to do this under the following umbrella of services:

- 1) Advocacy: Liaison with benefit services, local authorities and job opportunities/ recruitment services to define a clear route into long term housing and benefits.
 - 2) Medical: Access to medical care as well as health and wellness sessions.
- 3) Personal Care: Haircuts, threading, essential items, toiletries and a mobile shower facility.
- 4) Clothes Bank: A space to wash dirty clothes and stock up on new ones, sock/underwear bank.
- 5) Food Bank: A service that provides health conscious hot/cold meals as well as warm drinks.






This is an ambitious task, however, we need to start somewhere if we're going to achieve something big. So we started by setting up a soup kitchen at a local community centre on Benson Estate, Hounslow. The team at We Are One allowed us to use the premises for two weeks after which we served food at a local squat for the rest of the month.













We've realised a few salient things during this project:

- There are a wealth of homeless services already providing food, access routes into housing, benefits and alcohol and drug rehabilitation services in the borough.
- 2) The homeless in Hounslow are generally getting the help they need, however there are many who are addicted to hard drugs.
- 3) There are a few homeless individuals who are highly visible and give homeless people a bad name. Some aren't even homeless, but suffer from mental health issues.
- 4) Our resources are beginning to stretch and are better utilised working with already established services, or to revamp the project towards a new model.

After we took some time to think about the next steps, we decided on the following:

- 1) To provide seasonal practical help. For example, when a cold snap hits, ensuring the homeless are all indoors somewhere and are warm throughout the day.
- 2) To create a pamphlet of homeless services that has all the information a homeless person could possibly need- on what day to access which service in what location of the borough.
- 3) To provide some hope and support for the homeless by a "Beggars to Buskers" project.

World Poetry Day:

Charlotte House, Care UK - 20/03/18



We celebrated World Poetry Day in the best way Poetical Word knows how: spreading creativity and poetry as far and wide as we can.



We were invited by CARE UK to put on a poetry show for the elderly and engage them in all that is poetical. We shared poetry with them, played music for them, sang with them and ultimately had a great time.

Furthermore, we led the group

through a Creative Workshop and facilitated a session where we asked them to write down

some of their favourite words and we transformed them into one big poem, eccentrically performed!



To conclude the event, we couldn't help but continue our tradition with a photo of everyone together.





Poetical Word goes to see Tale Be Told in Camden



Project: Good Vibes



On the 11th of February 2018, we launched a series of posters that said 'take what you need' and offered everything from 'Love' to 'Freedom' to 'Strength'. By physically taking off a strip off the paper, you are making that conscious decision to evoke that which you have taken.

We began with placing a sheet on the community notice board in Starbucks, Hounslow. We then went around Hounslow Town Centre and put them up in other shops and restaurants. At the end of the day, we revisited Starbucks only to find that the sheet needed replacing. It was humbling to see the locals take faith in what was essentially a small idea to give back hope and ignite some creative inspiration. This project utilised the power of words to produce a positive impact in the lives of people.




We have since had the opportunity to spread this project to various locations across West London, The Orchard Cafe in Ealing, being one of them.



On the 19th of March 2018, we were officially incorporated at Companies House as a Community Interest Company. We're looking forward to achieving so much more due to this milestone.


